### OP-FILM. AN ARCHAEOLOGY OF OPTICS Filipa César & Louis Henderson Curated by Regina Barunke

The lighthouse—erected with the purpose of shedding light on the dark unknowns of the world—bears the wishes of a modernism obliged to enlightenment as no other structure: the superiority of reason and spirit over nature, the belief in technological progress as well as global commerce, carried by the idea of colonialism, imperialism and Christian mission. Optical inventions like the Fresnel lens in 1822, which has been employed in lighthouses ever since, assisted sea travel and naval artillery to establish the new world order. Its function is now assumed by radar as well as sonar and satellite- controlled navigational systems. In their film and the accompanying collection of material, Filipa César and Louis Henderson weave a cartographic and profoundly hybridized image-text fabric that examines how optical technologies convey 'Western' notions of military and colonial developments and are conveyed by them in turn

### About Filipa César and Louis Henderson

Filipa César, born 1975 in Porto, Portugal, Filipa César is an artist and filmmaker, living in Berlin. She is interested in the porous borders between the moving image and its reception, the fictional dimensions of the documentary and the economies, politics and poetics inherent to cinema praxis. Her work also takes media as a means to expose counter narratives of resistance to historicism. César studied 1996-1999 at the Fine Art Faculty, University Lisbon, 1999-2000 at the Academy of Fine Arts in Munich, and graduated 2008 with MA Kunst im Kontext at the UDK in Berlin. Born 1983 in Norwich/UK and currently lives in Porto and Paris, Louis Henderson is a filmmaker whose works investigate connections between colonialism, technology, capitalism and history. His research seeks to formulate an archaeological method within film practice, reflecting on new materialities of the Internet and the possibility for technoanimistic resistance to neocolonialism. A graduate of London College of Communication and Le Fresnoy – studio national des arts contemporains, Henderson completed his post-diplôme within an experimental art and research group at the European School of Visual Arts. Filipa César & Louis Henderson: Refracted Spaces (EN)

Filipa César & Louis Henderson imagine the lighthouse lens as a departing point to develop a critique of Western epistemology. In their lecture performance the artists will discuss the themes of their exhibition in relation to topics ranging from indigenous sea-navigation methods and cartographic law to forensic research of the Mediterranean refugee crisis; from aesthetic strategies of non-locality and opacity that interrupt optical surveillance to systemic racism embedded within technological developments; and from the materiality and ontology of blackness and black light to afrofuturist narratives of submarine resistance.

Louis Henderson: Glassy Culture. The Lighthouse at the Edge of Thought (EN)

The British artist and filmmaker Louis Henderson will talk about his researches, thoughts and the idea of presentation of the joint work "Op-Film: An Archaeology of Optics".

#### Wed 8 November, 7 pm- Lecture

Herta Wolf: Aimé Laussedat's Métrophotography. On the Historiography of a French Invention (DE)

Photogrammetry is a visualization process resulting from the technical and instrumental innovations of the early nineteenth century, which corresponds to the economic dictation of industrialization and is a universal image process that integrates different disciplines and research fields (such as astronomy, meteorology or the military sector).

The measurement method is a synthesis of cultural techniques and forms of knowledge, which could only be realized in a social sector, which, like the army, follows state orders. On the basis of the French origin of the photography-based measurement method and its developer, Aimé Laussedat, Herta Wolf aims to prove this thesis and show that not only the métrophotography but the (rhetoric of photography) itself belongs to the military knowledge base and to an innovative training facility such as the Paris École Polytechnique.

Herta Wolf is a professor for the History and Theory of Photography, from 1994 to 2010 she taught at the University of Duisburg-Essen, since 2010 at the Art History Department at the University of Cologne.
